#### Head's Update:

In this week's assembly the children were asked 'are all mistakes bad?' This generated lots of discussion, which led the children to understand that we can learn so much from our mistakes and that we can always get better at anything we do – even if we get it wrong at first. This is called having a 'Growth Mindset', which is what we are promoting here at Hillside. Please can you continue to encourage your children to have a Growth Mindset in everything they do. Also, consider how you model as parents, when you don't get things right first time.

The children were also shown a video clip called 'Austins Butterfly' (have a quick Google). This shows how not getting something right first time and having precise feedback can help a child achieve something great. Please take time to watch it, as it is really powerful. Thank you to Mrs Duffield for leading this assembly. If you would like to know more, please come and talk to us or Google – Growth mindset, as there's plenty of websites out there.

As the weather has got much colder and wetter recently, the children really do need to bring coats and a change of shoes for break and lunchtimes. We do encourage the children to use the field/orchard during these times, as they enjoy using the whole environment. Also, the tarmac areas are not big enough for our whole school to use and there would be too many accidents with children bumping into each other. Children are given time to change their shoes at break and lunchtimes and by changing into wellies/outdoor footwear we are protecting their school shoes and our classrooms from becoming too muddy.

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### **HEALTHY MINDS & SEND INFORMATION FROM MRS CLARKE, OUR INCLUSION MANAGER**

Our focus this year is helping our pupils learn the importance of keeping a healthy mind. This is especially important at the moment, as a recent report after an NHS survey suggests that one in eight young people aged under 19, and one in eighteen pre-school children in England have a mental health disorder, which can include depression, anxiety and anger issues. As part of our work on Healthy Minds, we will be opening our Chat Room on Tuesday and Thursday lunchtimes.

The Chat Room is a quiet space, staffed by one of our inclusion team, where children can come and talk about their worries and anxieties. It is open to all and is intended to be a way of reducing some of the pressure that a lot of young feel. After Christmas, we will be introducing the Chat Room to the pupils during assembly times. If you would like any further information about the chat room, please contact the inclusion team via the school office.

Recently we sent out a questionnaire to some of our parents of children with a Special Educational Need. The responses were overwhelmingly positive, and show that at Hillside we really do try our best to create a welcoming, nurturing environment where our children with SEND are well supported so that they can reach their full potential. One thing that was highlighted in the responses is that not everyone knows who the school SENCo is. Tracy Clarke is our Inclusion Manager, a role which also includes that of SENCo.
