Dear Parents and Carers.

They do say, time flies when you're having fun, and this half term we have had lots of fun learning opportunities. I can't believe we're nearly at the end of February!

This half term we've had a fabulous Science Week and the children have enjoyed our visiting Scientist who came in to do many exciting experiments including making slime, understanding energy and much more.

As well as our science week, Year 5 have visited Reading Museum to support their Creative Curriculum learning. The children dressed up as Victorian school children, took part in a Victorian Treasure Hunt and learnt more about the history of Reading. The children in Year 1 have been learning to ride bikes with the Bikeability team and Year 2 have been making cars for their Whacky Races project. Year 2 were also very privileged to have a 100 year old motor car visit the school to compare how differently cars are made today. A huge thank you to Ellie's Grandad for sharing his historical car with the children.

Last week, the school under went a Peer Review by 4 Head teacher's from the Future Thinking Partnership, of which we are part of. This was a rigorous assessment of the schools outcomes and school improvement priorities. I am pleased to say the day was very successful and the visiting head teachers were very impressed by our school, especially our fantastic children.

The head teachers agreed with the areas we are prioritising on improving, especially the focus we have on improving boys writing outcomes. Nationally, boys do not perform as well as girls in writing and we are working hard to close the gender gap in this area. If you are a parent of a boy, we would ask you to support your son with this target by encouraging them to write more at home. Try the following: Make writing purposeful e.g. write a film review /poster on something recently seen at the cinema or on TV. Make notes and draw diagrams about models they make. Boys often need more breaks when writing, so try incorporating 5 minute rests when writing. Have a word bank available to support with the spellings and don't focus too much on the handwriting, praise the content. Also, try writing one sentence each and creating a list of fantastic words that can be used in their writing. Just as important in improving writing, is the amount of exposure children have to good quality stories. Not just stories they read to themselves but stories you read to your children. Take time to discuss the quality of the grammar, punctuation in stories and magpie (borrow) great words to be used in their own writing. If you have any further questions about writing please talk to your child's class teacher or ask at Parents Evening.
